

Affirmation of Baptism Final Expectations - 2021

This is an informational packet with upcoming dates and expectations for the end of the Confirmation journey and the beginning of the confirmand's life of faith as an adult in the church.

Expectations – Due by September 1

- 100% of Lessons - All Missed Lessons need to be made up. For the 2020-2021 School Year, please watch missed ConfirmU videos with your youth and engage in discussion about the videos.
- 2 Church Visits/year
- Volunteer 4 times in Sunday morning worship/year
- 15 worship notes/year
- Memory Work (2 of the following) Memory work means being familiar enough to get the general understanding of the item, and being able to say it without much help or saying it alongside someone else.
 - Books of Bible
 - 10 Commandments and explanations to each
 - Apostle's Creed
 - Lord's Prayer

Personal Statement of Faith

Each student will write their own personal statement of faith. See Pages 4 and 5.

Confirmation Retreat

The Retreat will be in June of 2021. Dates will be sent out in April.

The Retreat will be at Cross of Christ Lutheran Church. The confirmands will spend time together, and the high school students will be invited so they can welcome these incoming ninth graders to the high school youth group. **All confirmands are expected to attend.**

The Retreat will cover:

- The five promises the confirmands will make when they affirm their Baptism
- Introduction and team building for High School youth group
- Confirmation Reflection
- Planning the Confirmation Service in October
- Questions/Reflection for Faith Statements - Each student will meet with Laura Anderson to discuss Faith Statements
- Each student can complete their memory work at this retreat, or they can wait until their interview

Students who do not attend will need to work individually with Laura Anderson on the faith statement and review the retreat workbook that covers the promises. Students will need to schedule a time to meet with Laura Anderson to review the rough draft of their faith statement.

Confirmation Bible Verse – Due Sunday, July 11, with Rough Draft

Each student will choose a personal Confirmation Bible verse that is meaningful to them. **On Page 6 - 13 are suggestions of confirmation verses.** Students do not have to pick from this list. Parents, mentors, or church staff are great resources if students are having difficulty picking a Bible verse. All verses will be from the NRSV Bible translation unless otherwise requested. This will be included at the top of your faith statement.

Picture

A picture of each confirmand is needed by October 1. Please email a current photo to Laura Anderson. Please include the confirmand's name as the subject of the image.

Robes

On **Sunday, September 12 at 10:30 a.m.** in the youth room, students will be measured for robes. The cost is \$25 – checks are to be made payable to Cross of Christ. The robes will be given to families at the confirmation rehearsal and will need to be turned back into the church after pictures on Confirmation Sunday.

A parent will need to volunteer to help take measurements. If you are able to do this, please contact Laura Anderson.

Confirmation Feedback

During the Confirmation Retreat, confirmands will have time to share about their confirmation experience with adult leaders. This helps to strengthen this ministry into the future.

Approval of Council

All students will need to be approved by the church Council. Students will need to attend the Council Meeting on **October 12 (Tuesday) at 6:30 p.m.** Confirmation Faith Statements will be the first part of the agenda for the meeting; students need to stay for the reading of ALL faith statements and the approval. Plan for an hour. Students will be asked to introduce themselves and read their faith statement. Parents, Sponsors, and Mentors are invited to this meeting as well. Please bring a copy of your confirmand's faith statement.

Rehearsal

The confirmation rehearsal will be on **Wednesday, October 27 at 7:00 p.m.** in the sanctuary. All Confirmands need to attend.

Confirmation Sunday

Confirmation students will help plan and lead the worship service. At the Confirmation Retreat, Laura Anderson will assign worship leaders for the service. All students will participate. This includes singing or playing in the Praise Band.

Confirmation Students – This is a very important day in your faith journey and it would not have been possible without the support of your family and friends. Please remember to invite these special people to share in this day with you; your baptismal sponsors, small group leaders, and your mentors.

Arrive at CCLC by **10:15 a.m. on October 31.** Fellowship time will be in honor of all students affirming their baptism, and a time to visit with guests and the congregation. At about 10:45 a.m. students will robe, receive a flower, and line up. **Parents will need to help with this process. Pictures will be taken immediately following the service. A parent with a good camera will be needed.**

If your student is having difficulty in any way with what they believe or if they want to be confirmed, please contact Laura Anderson. Let us help you and your student with their faith discernment. Affirmation of Baptism is not a sacrament, a requirement, or a graduation. It is a choice, one that your student will have to make for themselves.

FAITH STATEMENT

The Faith Statement is a chance for you to share your faith and to state your Christian beliefs with the congregation. During baptism, your parents and sponsors made promises to teach you about the Christian faith and to bring you up in the church. Now that you have been through your confirmation instruction, you will make promises of your own. This faith statement is one way to help you articulate your own faith and beliefs. The theme of the faith statement is:

“This is what my faith means to me...”

Keep in mind:

- * Be yourself - this is not a research paper. We want to know what you think and what you believe.
- * Be honest – do not say things that you think we want to hear, but what you actually believe.

Laura Anderson will read these faith statements, ask deep questions, and may request edits and additions. Your faith statement should cover most if not all the following questions, but you are not limited to these questions.

What does it mean to me to be a Christian?

Who is God to you? Who is Jesus Christ to you? How do you see the Holy Spirit working in your life and in the world?

Tell us about your faith journey...

How have I grown in my Faith through confirmation?

What adults had an impact on my faith development so far? How?

What significant events have shaped my faith life so far? How?

What is your Bible verse and why did you pick it? Why is it significant in your faith journey?

How does my faith affect the rest of my life? (example: in school, at home, with friends)

How do you see your faith at work in your life today? What does it mean to you?

Where do you see your faith leading you in the future?

How do you intend to fulfill the promises you will make in your Affirmation of Baptism Service?

...to live among God’s faithful people,

... to hear his word and share in his supper,

... to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,

...to serve all people in the example of our Lord Jesus,

...and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth.

Parents, please read through your confirmand’s paper. It is okay to help them with grammar and the development/expression of their ideas and thoughts. Use this opportunity to talk to your students about your own faith. When they turn in their final paper, we will assume the parents have read it and approve it. These papers will be printed for the whole congregation to see and the confirmands will read them to the church Council. Please encourage your confirmand to start early, take their time, and think about what they want to write and express.

Format of Final Draft

All Faith Statements should have the following format.

1. Typed, Double Space, 12-point font, Times New Roman
2. Name and Confirmation Information at the top left
3. Bible Verse – italics and centered Bible Reference including version (NRSV)
4. Faith Statement (body of text)

Confirmation Information & Verse

This should be added to the top left of your faith statement

1. Full Name (First, Middle and Last)
2. Parent’s Names
3. Baptismal Date
4. Baptismal Sponsors
5. Confirmation Mentor

Example:

Martin Luther

Parents: Hans and Margarethe Luther

Baptismal Date: November 10, 1483

Baptismal Sponsors: Uncle Jimbo and Aunt Jombi

Mentor: Saint Augustine
