



WORD

READING

1 Corinthians 12:12-31a

A reading from the book of 1st Corinthians.

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.

Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many. If the foot were to say, 'Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body', that would not make it any less a part of the body. And if the ear were to say, 'Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body', that would not make it any less a part of the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. If all were a single member, where would the body be? As it is, there are many members, yet one body. The eye cannot say to the hand, 'I have no need of you', nor again the head to the feet, 'I have no need of you.' On the contrary, the members of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, and those members of the body that we think less honourable we clothe with greater honour, and our less respectable members are treated with greater respect; whereas our more respectable members do not need this. But God has so arranged the body, giving the greater honour to the inferior member, that there may be no dissension within the body, but the members may have the same care for one another. If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honoured, all rejoice together with it.

Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it. And God has appointed in the church first apostles, second prophets, third teachers; then deeds of power, then gifts of healing, forms of assistance, forms of leadership, various kinds of tongues. Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work miracles? Do all possess gifts of healing? Do all speak in tongues? Do all interpret? But strive for the greater gifts. And I will show you a still more excellent way.

God has been revealed to us in the Word.

Let us wait here and dwell in it.



RAINBOW TRAIL'S PHILOSOPHY...

Rainbow Trail Lutheran Camp is an outreach ministry of the Rocky Mountain Synod, Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. We serve Lutherans in Colorado, New Mexico, Wyoming, Utah, and El Paso, Texas.

Rainbow Trail's sole purpose is to be an extension of the ministries happening in congregations. Our goal is to provide a place away from the normal routine where people are renewed, refreshed, and challenged to be stronger Christians in our world and in their home congregations.

Our summer program focuses on camper involvement, leadership development, and spiritual growth in a Christian environment. Congregational leaders and Pastors are key members of our staff as they interact in study, play, and worship with our campers.

Safety is paramount to the Rainbow Trail experience. We strive to provide a safe environment; taking into consideration not only campers physical safety, but also emotional and spiritual safety.

SOME OF OUR PROGRAMS...

- Eight weeks of Summer Youth Camp are held at RTALC every year. There are a variety of programs for ages 6-18.
- Family Camps are opportunities for your whole family to come to camp together. We offer 2 full weeks in the summer, and Labor Day Weekend in September.
- One of our fastest growing programs is Day Camp. RTALC comes to your church for a Mon-Fri program of Bible Study, Arts and Crafts, Music and Recreation.
- Compass Points is for junior and senior high individuals and charter groups. Includes, backpack, rock climbing, rafting, and high ropes. Spend a week in the Sangre de Cristo Mountains challenging your faith and your body.
- Bridging Borders is for senior high youth. Spend a week either leading Day Camp and helping build a medical clinic in Ecuador, building a house in the Dominican Republic, helping a family with repairs in Appalachia, or building a house for a family in Anapra, Mexico.


