Martin Luther also states that daily bread is given, "even to all evil people!" Discuss with your parent what you think this means?

Finally we "ask in this prayer that God causes us to recognize what our daily bread is and to receive it with thanksgiving." Discuss with your parent

We sometimes get wrapped up into what we want vs what we need. We have an abundance of what we need, and others do not – what we want is not that important. But rather our call as disciples is to be Christ's hands, Christ's feet and work towards others receiving what they NEED.
