- 4. How can we help God to deliver others from evil?

Lesson Insights:

- We are challenged most in our faith, when we feel God has disappointed us. "Bad things happen to Good People" - and we can't figure out "Where is God in this."
- Lutherans believe that God responds to evil.
- God is with us, walking with us, drawing us into a new life with God through our Baptism
- We pray this petition, this prayer because we know that God is constantly bringing us out of darkness, redeeming us, nourishing us.
- We pray this petition to be REMINDED that God is at work in our live in this way.
