#### TALK:

All of it - Not what we do or how we do it, it is what God does for us.

### READ: Open your Bibles and read Ephesians 4: 5 - 6

### Here are the promises that your parents made when you were baptized.

- To live among God's faithful people
- Bring them to the word of God and the holy supper
- Teach them the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments
- Place in their hands the holy scripture
- Nurture them in faith and prayer so they can learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed and care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace.

### Here are the promises you will make when you affirm your baptism on Confirmation Sunday

- To live among God's faithful people
- To hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper
- To proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed
- To serve all people, following the the example of Jesus,
- To strive for justice and peace in all the earth.
