Read Matthew 26:17:30-This is another place where we get the concept of Holy Communion from in the Bible.

+ TALK:

- A sacrament is an act that is commanded by Christ, uses a material or earthly element, and through connection with the Word is the bearer of God's promise.
- Sacraments include: Christ's command, earthly elements (water, bread, wine) and God's word/promise.
- There are two sacraments in the Lutheran Church: Holy Baptism and Holy Communion.
- We believe Jesus commanded us to celebrate Holy Communion.
- We believe that only ordained pastors can preside over the sacraments, but everyone can receive and take part in them.

We come seeking your grace and forgiveness with trust believing you hear us, and you forgive us. You give us another chance to start anew. Thank you for your love. In Jesus' name we pray, Amen.
