- 1. Sola Scriptura ("Scripture alone"): The <u>Bible</u> alone is our highest authority.
- 2. *Sola Fide* ("faith alone"): We are saved through <u>faith</u> alone in Jesus Christ.
- 3. Sola Gratia ("grace alone"): We are saved by the grace of God alone.
- 4. Solus Christus ("Christ alone"): Jesus Christ alone is our Lord, Savior, and King.
- 5. Soli Deo Gloria ("to the glory of God alone"): We live for the <u>glory</u> of God alone.

Black cross in a **red** heart: The black cross representing crucifixion rests inside a red heart representing Christ's love and sacrifice.

The **red** heart rests on white roses. The white roses represent comfort, peace, and joy in Christ. It also represents the angels and the color of the Spirit. (with green stems between the petals) The white roses rest on a bed of **blue** that represents the sky and the heavens-reminding us of the joy of heaven

All of this is surrounded by a gold ring that represents the unending blessedness of heaven that endures forever.
