♣ TALK:

Parent and Youth-discuss and write out answers where indicated.

Look up the meaning of your names. What are they?

Discuss how you got your name. Were you named after a friend, the Bible, a family member. Do you like your name? Why or why not?

Look up the meaning of your names. That are they.							

Discuss: Is knowing the meaning of your name important to you? Why or why not?

Names are also sacred. When you know someone's name, you honor a part of their identity. God's name is not something to be taken lightly or used as an exclamation point when we are excited, surprised, or mad. God's name should mean something. **God's name is holy and sacred.** We should always treat God's name that way-with reverence.

Knowing God's name helps us understand:

- Who God is
- God's relationship with us

When you know God's name, you possess a way to approach God for everything you need. We are invited to use God's name. God wants a relationship with us. God wants to connect to us.

Activity

Write God's name in the center of a blank piece of paper with a marker and decorate it. There are a variety of names for God. Pick the one you like best. Around the edges, draw, write words or images that describe who God is to you. Attach your drawing to this Make-Up Lesson and include it when you submit it.

♣ PRAY:

Using the name for God you drew on your paper, each person can offer one prayer request they have. If you cannot think of a prayer request, pray for the Holy Land or Afghanistan and the earthquake victims, for people who struggle with addiction or those who are bullied. There are always things we can pray for together!

- i.e. Person 1: Savior....please be with my Grandpa.
 - Person 2: Savior...please be with the people in the Holy Land.

End: Savior....be with our household. Help us to hold your name sacred and praise your name every day. Amen.
