Read the 7th Commandment and Luther’s Meaning in your Small Catechism

Commandments 4 - 10 are about our relationship with our neighbor.

Read Luther’s meaning of this commandment again.

There are two parts to this commandment. What we do TO others and what we do FOR others.

6. What does Luther say that we should do TO others?

God tells us that possessions are important. God gives us everything we have and everything we need. In the Lord’s Prayer, Daily Bread, refers to God giving us our relationships, government, and good weather. God gives us things that nurture life; food, clothing, a home, some money to live off of.

God wants our stuff to be protected - so we are protected. To live safely and securely in this world, we need to be able to trust that what is ours will remain ours. This is not talking about NOT sharing, it is talking about other things being taken from you.

It is about Trust. We live in a better world when we can trust one another. Being fair and honest in all things.

This commandment is NOT just about protecting our stuff, it is also about HOW we get our stuff. God is concerned with how we get our stuff. Whenever we try to get what belongs to someone else through UNJUST dealings, it's stealing, because we are denying your neighbor a fair return.

Be fair and honest in all things. The commandment, Do not Steal, seems easy enough to follow. But his commandment is more than that. It is also about **omission**.
