Main Idea: We honor God when we are content with what we have and when we help others keep what they have.

✚ SHARE:

Invite each other to share one high (good thing from the week) and one low (harder part of the week).

✚ READ:

Read 2 Samuel 11:1-27

Read Luke 12:15

- **Read the 9th and 10th Commandments and their meaning in your catechism.**

Remember that the Commandments are about relationships.

- What relationship is the focus of Commandments 1-3?

- What relationship(s) are the focus of Commandments 4-10?

✚ TALK:

Parent and Youth-discuss and write out answers where indicated.

1. What do you think it means to guard against every kind of greed in your life? (Luke 12:15)

2. How was David not content with what he had? (From 2 Samuel 11)

3. How did David not help his neighbor (literal neighbor) keep what he had? (From 2 Samuel 11)

4. Talk about: What is something you covet now or have coveted in your life?

5. What things do you have enough or more than enough of in your life?

6. What are some examples of things belonging to others that you can help them protect and keep?

The 9th and 10th commandments focus on two parts:

1. Being content with what we have
2. Helping protect what our neighbors have

✚ PRAY

Take a moment to pray together. You may use your own words, or the words provided.

Dear God, please help me find contentment in all that you give to me. Please give me the wisdom and the courage to help protect the things that belong to others. Help us live in right relationship with you and with our neighbor. In Jesus' name we pray, Amen.

✚ BLESS

Close with offering a blessing to one another. Make a sign of the cross on one another's forehead or hand. Say, "May you know God is with you today!"
