Out with the Old and In with the New

We left off with the Old Testament and the prophets. The Israelites returning home after exile with their enemies. They restored Jerusalem, their homes, and their way of life. There is no King but the people are united.

Between the Old Testament and the New Testament there is 400 years of silence. God's voice is silent.

When we open the book of Matthew it is entirely a different nation. Now Rome occupies Israel as well as their rule has spread throughout the world. There is a King...descended from Esau...Herod the Great...appointed by Rome. King Herod was violent and Jews were persecuted under Roman rule. The Temple is still the center of worship and has been destroyed and restored many times. Synagogues have sprung up in many cities...they are the center of Jewish Life.

The New Testament review

The New Testament is about Jesus (birth, life and ministry, and his death. It also covers about 100 years of church history after his death. It was written by his followers many years after Jesus lived and tells how the disciples lived and spread the gospel. People remembered the stories and passed them along before they were written.

The New Testament was written in Greek Read from Left to Right Contains Vowels but no punctuation

 History - Acts (only one book) Written by Luke Tells the story of the birth of the church and the spread of Christianity Pentecost Peter & Paul
Read Acts 2: 43 - 47 What do the early church and today's church have in common?
Epistles = Letter (21) • Written mostly by Paul (13) Romans - Philemon • Gives encouragements / warnings to the people and churches he started List five letters written by Paul:
Read Galatians 5: 22 - 26 Discuss with your parents - which of these fruits of the Spirit is the easiest for you? Which of these fruits are the most challenging for you and why?
 Universal Letters (7) Hebrews - Jude Letters written to church or people Unknown authors Gives a message of hope and love in Christ.
 Prophecy - Revelation (only one book) John was a pastor who was exiled to the island of Patmos (off of Greece) Exile because of the anti-Christian persecution of Rome Wrote Revelation Tells of Jesus' Final Victory
Read Revelation 21: 1 - 4 Discuss with your parents - when you think of heaven, what do you imagine it being like or looking like?
