Read Matthew 25:31-46 & James 2:15-16

What do you think this Jesus is telling us to do in the world?

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How are we to treat one another?

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What does this Scripture have to do with hunger and poverty in the world?

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**Catechism Connection:**  
*Read and discuss together. Write your responses.*

Read the fourth petition of the Lord's Prayer and its meaning in your catechism.

*Bread at the time of Jesus was more than life-giving, it was life sustaining. Making and having bread was challenging. It was hard work. At the time of Jesus, it meant more than just food, it meant anything that you needed for nourishment, in your body and in your spirit.*

In the meaning of the fourth petition, Martin Luther writes that “*God gives daily bread without our prayer....*” Do you agree with this meaning? Why or why not?

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Martin Luther also states that daily bread is given, “*even to all evil people!*”

Discuss with your parent/guardian about what you think this means?

*This is the meaning of grace. This is Christ’s sacrifice, for which he died on the cross. It was not just for the good and faithful, but it was for ALL people.*

Finally, we “*ask in this prayer that God causes us to recognize what our daily bread is and to receive it with thanksgiving.*”

Discuss with your parent/guardian.

*We sometimes get wrapped up in what we want versus what we need. We have an abundance of what we need, and others do not. Our call as disciples is to be Christ’s hands and work towards helping others receive what they NEED.*
